## **Supplementary Regulations**

### **1. Title and Nature of the Event:**

The event is entitled the Filmer Delivery , Loveday 250 (herein after called the Event), being Round 1 of 2018 ARB SAORRA Multi-club Series.

The event will be conducted at Loveday 4x4 Adventure Park, 15k South of Barmera in the Riverland SA.

This event is an Enduro Course Off Road Racing Event run over a variety of surfaces and is designed to test driver's skill and preparation during daylight hours. The event consists of a prologue of approximately 6.0 kms in length and the full course is approximately 250 kms, comprising 7 laps of 35 km.

### **2. Authority and Permit:**

The Event will be held under the National Competition Rules of Australian Auto-Sport Alliance Pty Ltd (AASA), the Off Road Racing Regulations for AASA and the ARB SAORRA Championship Regulations, these Supplementary Regulations and any Bulletins issued.

The Event is authorized by AASA Permit No: AASA060418/GRKCC3063

### **3. Sponsors:**

## 6. Entries Details:

Entries; A minimum of 16 entries and a maximum of 50 will be accepted. All entries must be made on the official ONLINE entry form and must be accompanied with the requisite entry fee. A link to the on line entry form can be found on the event page at [offroadracing.com.au](http://offroadracing.com.au).

Entries open on Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> March at 9 am 2018 and close at midnight (ACST) Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> April 2018.

The entry fee for the event will be \$175.00 plus there will also be an admission fee into Loveday 4x4 Adventure park payable at the gate of \$20 per person for the weekend. This covers onsite camping as well. This applies to every person over 14 years of age. Under 14 entry is free.

**Additional Co-Drivers/Navigators** may compete, providing they are properly nominated on the entry form, have signed the Disclaimer.

The organisers reserve the right to abandon, cancel or postpone the event if less than 16 entries are received by close of entries or affected by adverse weather

## 7. Passes (Wrist Bands)

Passes (wristbands) will be issued to Drivers, Co-Driver, Navigators and Service Crew with names and competition numbers on them. Wrist bands **MUST** be worn at all times. These passes will permit access to the Paddock Area whilst racing is in progress.

## 8. Scrutiny

All vehicles must have either a current AASA vehicle Passport/Log book or equivalent and all safety apparel and be presented at scrutiny for inspection. If competitors have two vehicle log books, it is requested that they produce both at scrutiny.

All vehicles must be presented for scrutiny as follows;

## **9. Documentation**

All competitors must bring the following documents to Event Headquarters on Friday 6<sup>th</sup> April 2018 between 3:00pm and 7:00pm.

Vehicle Passport/Log Book, Competition Licence, Proof of Current Car Club Membership, Proof of Age for under 18 years, Civil Drivers Licence where required.

All entered competitors, drivers, co-drivers and navigators must sign the relevant disclaimers at Event Headquarters during event documentation.

Vehicle Passports/Log books will be retained at Event Headquarters until the completion of competition for that vehicle.

## **10. Event Details:**

### **10.1 Competing Crew Briefings:**

Briefings for competing crew will be conducted prior to the Prologue on Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> April at 10:10 am with sign on from 10:00am. Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> April will begin at 08:45 am with sign on from 08:30 am before the event proper. Crew Briefings will take place at Event Headquarters. It is compulsory for all competing crew to attend and to have signed on prior to the start of briefing.

### **10.2 Reconnaissance:**

Reconnaissance of the Prologue track and the Race Track will be conducted on Friday 6<sup>th</sup> April starting at 16:00 pm. Reconnaissance must be done in a suitable road registered vehicle and each occupant of the vehicle must wear a seat belt. Only 1 lap of the enduro course and 1 lap of the Prologue course is permitted. Any Competitor deemed to be driving in a manner not complying with the instructions may be excluded from the event.

### **10.3 Prologue:**

A prologue to determine the start order for Lap 1 will be run over one lap of the Prologue course at 10.30 am Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> April. Vehicles will be started at 1 minute intervals. The prologue order will be published on the event page at [offoradracing.com.au](http://offoradracing.com.au) and be available at Event documentation. Starting order for the race will be determined by the time to complete the 6 km prologue track with fastest beginning first. Competitors not finishing the prologue will start behind the last competitor in their class. There will be no seeding, in accordance with SAORRA regulations.

### **10.4 Event:**

The event will be conducted in 5 sections with vehicles starting a minimum of 30 seconds apart.

Section 1: 1 lap of the 35 km course, commencing at 12:30 pm Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> April.

Section 2: 2 continuous laps of the 35km course, commencing at 14:30 pm Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> April.

Section 3: 1 lap of the 35 km course, commencing at 09:00 am Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> April.

Section 4: 2 continuous laps of the 35km course, commencing at 10:50 am Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> April.

Section 5: 1 lap of the 35 km course, commencing at 13:25 pm Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> April.

The total competitive distance will be approximately 250 km.

### **10.5 Allowed Time:**

The Winners will be the competitors that complete the most laps in the least time.

To be classified as a finisher, a crew shall complete 70% of the race distance within the time allowed as follows:

Section 1 & 5: 45 minutes

Sections 2, 3 & 4: 1 hour 30 minutes each.

## **11. Timing and Start Lights/Flag**

Timing officials will be deemed Judge of Fact.

Timing begins when the signal to start is given.

Times to one thousandths of a second will be recorded on every lap and completed laps within the time allowed will be counted.

A competitor's score shall be the total elapsed time for all laps, passing through all controls.

## **12. Competition Rules**

A vehicle that arrives to the start after its schedule starting time will be allowed to start at the next safe time or at the discretion of the Clerk of Course, provided it does not impede the start of any other competitor. The elapsed time begins on the original schedule starting time.

**Smoking is not permitted** in the pits, paddock or in race vehicles at any time during competition. You are required to supply your own INCIDENT STATUS (OK/SOS) sign for enduro course races.

## **13. Protest**

Protests may be made via the Competitor Relations Officer who will refer to the Clerk of Course. Upon judgement if the competitor is unhappy a further protest may be lodged with the AASA Stewards with the appropriate fee.

## **14. Eligibility**

### **14.1 Vehicle Eligibility**

Refer to AASA & AORRA Vehicle eligibility criteria and classes.

### **14.2 Crew Eligibility**

To be eligible for SAORRA Multi Club Series points you must be a financial member of one of the clubs listed below (refer SAORRA Multi Club Series Regulations) and holds an appropriate current AASA or equivalent Licence.

Each crew shall consist of two persons (with exception of vehicles fitted with one seat).

Competitors may at any time, up to close of scrutiny, change vehicle and /or driver / navigator on the entry form upon notification to the Clerk of Course or Secretary of the Meeting.

SAORRA listed Clubs are; Adelaide Buggy Club, Gawler Road Knights Car Club, Limestone Coast Off Road Club, Millicent Sand Buggy Club, Onkaparinga Ramblers Car Club, Spencer Gulf Off Road Assn., Summit Racing Team Car Club, Waikerie Riverland Off Road Assn.

## **15. General**

### **15.1 Safety**

All Competitors MUST comply with the current AASA Regulations

All Drivers and Navigators must wear helmets and apparel as per the 2017 AASA Off Road Apparel Requirements.

### **15.2 Refuelling and Hot Work Area**

ALL REFUELLING and service at the venue MUST BE DONE IN THE PADDOCK being the designated Refuelling area for this event during service/break time.

Any vehicles needing to refuel outside of the mandatory service periods will be provided a refuelling lane adjacent to the start finish line. Two service crew for each car will be allowed into the refuel lane and any vehicle entering the refuel lane must come to a complete stop with both occupants exiting the vehicle before fuel caps can be removed occupants can reenter the vehicle once the fuel cap has been replaced.

All persons involved in refuelling operations, or within three metres of refuelling or venting points whilst the vehicle is being refuelled, are to wear the correct attire of a minimum of at least shoes with non-flammable socks and clothing from neck to wrist to ankle, and have the minimum fire extinguisher on standby. Refer to Standing Regulations.

ALL WELDING, OPEN FLAMES and GRINDING must occur in the HOT WORK AREA. UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES is any welding, grinding etc. permitted outside of the HOT AREA. Any competitor who does so will be excluded from the competition and asked to leave the venue.

All fuel used in competition vehicles must be commercially available diesel or unleaded fuel.

### **15.3 Course Markers**

The course is marked as per the AASA Standing Regulations for Off Road Racing Events.

### **15.4 Judges of Fact**

Control Officials, Starter and Timekeepers will be deemed Judges of Fact with regard to whether or not a vehicle follows the prescribed course, relative order, time of arrival, direction of travel, direction of entry into controls, start procedure and jumping the start. Time keepers and radar

operators will be deemed Judges of fact as to whether a vehicle exceeds speed limit on reconnaissance.

Recovery officials, outriders and control officials will be deemed Judges of Fact with regard to track deviation/short cutting.

## **16. Points and Awards**

### **16.1 Determination of the Winner**

The Registered Competitor that completes the most distance in the least time (including Penalty time) is the winner.

### **16.2 Awards**

The following trophies will be awarded at the completion of the event.

Trophies will be awarded to Drivers and Navigators 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each class (depending on number of entries) plus

## **17. General:**

Officials may be supplied with a wrist band or an Official Pass that is to be worn on the outer of clothing at all times.

At the completion of the day's competition, NO vehicles other than officials involved in recovery and final sweep are to be on the course.

No persons are allowed on the course without permission of the Clerk of Course

Medical Facilities will be provided by St John Ambulance

Recovery Vehicles shall recover competition vehicles after each competitive section or at the Clerk of Course direction. Any competitor that needs to be towed by another vehicle (other than an Official Vehicle provided by the Organiser) will need permission from the Clerk of Course.

A condition of entry is that the track can be watered at the discretion of the Promoters and no Protest will be accepted on this action, or Timing, Regrouping and Heat Order.

## **18. Insurance:**

AASA Public Liability and Personal Accident Insurance will be provided for Competitors, competing Crew, nominated service crew and officials.

## **19. Postponed, Abandonment or Cancellation:**

The Organisers reserve the right to postpone, abandon or cancel the Event.

## **20. Catering:**

Catering will be provided at the track throughout the weekend.

## **21. Camping:**

THERE WILL BE CAMPING AVAILABLE AT THE TRACK.

A designated camping area will be available at the cost of \$20 per person over the age of 14.

Showers and toilets will be available.

Notification and the purchase of camping passes with your entry is required if you intend to camp and wrist bands will be issued to all campers.

**Fires ARE NOT PERMITTED anywhere on the property due to the fire ban period being in force.**
