

ARB AUSTRALIAN OFF ROAD RACING CHAMPIONSHIP REGULATIONS









1. EVENTS

The 2022 ARB Australian Off Road Racing Championship will consist of four rounds:

Round 1	Rainbow, Vic	01-03 April
Round 2	Hillston, NSW	08-10 July
Round 3	Goondiwindi, Qld	12-14 August
Round 4	Millicent, SA	23-25 September

A minimum of two events must be held for the 2022 ARB Australian Off Road Racing Championship to be declared valid and awards / trophies issued. The committee will assess any and all state border restrictions or unforeseen impacts to an events ability to run, and deem it fair and reasonable to be included as a round of a national championship.

2. RUNNING DETAILS

All events in the 2022 ARB Australian Off Road Racing Championship will be national enduro events and conducted in accordance with the:

- National Competition Rules (NCRs) of the Australian Auto-Sport Alliance Pty Ltd (AASA) including Appendices
- AASA Event Operations Manual
- AASA Standing Regulations
- AASA Standing Regulations for Off Road Racing Events
- AASA Requirements for Vehicles for Off Road Racing Events
- AASA Health, Safety & Environment policy
- these ARB Australian Off Road Racing Championship Regulations
- Event Regulations
- any Additional Regulations and/or Announcements/Bulletins as published.

All events will be conducted with consideration to risk management, occupational, health and safety and Covid-19 health requirements.

START ORDER

Prologue is the preferred method of determining the event starting order and may be followed by a shootout. If a prologue is not able to be run, the event starting order will be determined by recent prologue results.

A crew/driver not finishing the prologue may, on application to the Clerk of Course, be seeded into the starting order based on recent prologue results.

3. ADVERTISING

By entering any event in the 2022 ARB Australian Off Road Racing Championship, Clubs, Corporations and persons agree to refer to the Championship by its full title: - ARB Australian Off Road Racing Championship. All promotional material must include the full title. To be eligible for points, competitors shall display supplied decals on each side of vehicle.

4. FORWARD FACING NUMBERS ON VEHICLES

Forward facing numbers shall be fixed to the top left hand corner of the vehicle's sun visor and be 75mm in height or located on bonnet and must be visible for officials when lining up cars.

5. TITLES AND AWARDS

To be eligible for Championship titles and awards, the competitor must have qualified for start points at a minimum of two ARB Australian Off Road Racing Championship events and completed 100% race distance in at least one event.

PRESENTATION

The ARB Australian Off Road Racing Championship awards will be provisionally presented at the event presentation of the final round of the ARB Australian Off Road Racing Championship.

OUTRIGHT CHAMPIONS

The first 3 outright driver place getters will receive trophies and prizes as determined by the ARB Australian Off Road Racing Championship Committee. Navigator trophies will be awarded to the driver's nominated navigator.

CLASS CHAMPIONS

The first 3 driver place getters in each class will receive trophies and prizes as determined by the ARB Australian Off Road Racing Championship Committee. Navigator trophies will be awarded to the driver's nominated navigator.

6. POINT SCORE

Points will be awarded as per the tables below. Competitors must have registered with the Championship online at arboffroadracing.com.au by 7pm on the dates as follows:

7pm Thursday 31st March to receive points at rounds 1, 2, 3 and 4 7pm Thursday 7th July to receive points at rounds 2, 3 and 4 7pm Thursday 11th August to receive points at rounds 3 and 4

Only the driver is eligible for points and can receive points from one entry per event. A driver can nominate a navigator to receive end of year Championship awards. All four rounds will count towards a competitors point score. The point score will be published on arboffroadracing.com.au. Enquiries can be emailed to help@offroadracing.com.au.

CHAMPIONSHIP REGISTRATION POINTS

20 outright and class points will be awarded to each competitor who registers for the 2022 ARB Australian Off Road Racing Championship prior to the close of registration for round 1 of the Championship (7pm Thursday 31st March). Championship registration points will only apply to competitors who start an event.

START POINTS

5 outright points and 5 class points will be awarded to each valid entry prepared to start the event. For example the entered crew and vehicle have presented for scrutiny at the event scrutiny venue.

FINISH POINTS

10 outright points and 10 class points will be awarded to each Championship registered competitor who has completed 100% race distance of the entered event.

OUTRIGHT AND CLASS POINTS

Outright and class points will be awarded based on laps completed and total elapsed time. A competitor must complete a minimum lap count as per the table below to qualify for outright and class placing points.

TIES/COUNTBACK

Outright

In the event of a tie within the top three placings outright, the winner will be determined by a countback - whomever had the higher outright finishing positions.

Class

In the event of a tie within the top three placings of a class, the winner will be determined by a countback - whomever had the higher class finishing positions. If the competitors earned the same class finishing positions the winner will be decided on who placed higher in the outright Championship points. In the event of a tie for the outright position, the winner will be decided on whomever had the higher outright finishing positions throughout the year.

LAPS TO QUALIFY

Minimum completed laps to qualify for outright and class position points.

7. COMPETITION NUMBERS

First, second and third outright place getters will be eligible to run competition numbers 1, 2 and 3 for the following year at AORRA/AASA sanctioned events.

First, second and third class place getters will be eligible to run competition numbers 01, 02, and 03 in their class, ie 101, 102, 103, 401, 402, 403 etc for the following year at AORRA/AASA sanctioned events.
